

Dear Camper,

Following is an application for the Counselor-In-Training (CIT) program for the 2010 summer season. The session dates for the CIT program will be from June 27 through July 30 for the Resident Camps and June 28 through July 30 for Day Camp.

We welcome all returning and new campers to apply to the CIT program, however in order to be considered for this program you must meet the following requirements by **June 1st, 2010**:

- Resident Camp: 16 years old and completed 10th grade.
- Day Camp: 15 years old and completed 9th grade.

The CIT program is designed to give participants the opportunity to experience the role of working with children. It also helps develop leadership, communication and self awareness skills through fun and appropriate social activities. This program is very selective. We are looking for candidates who are serious about broadening their leadership skills, who are interested in working with children and who aren't afraid of hard work.

Attached you will find all the information needed to complete the CIT application process. You will need to send us your application, registration form with deposit, and three references. References can include teachers, employers, guidance counselors, principals, and extended family members (aunts, uncles, grandparents) who are able to speak of your character and leadership abilities. We will contact you to set up an interview once we have received your completed application packet.

Please note, in order for your application to be considered complete, you must have submitted your application, registration form with deposit, and three references.

Completed applications must be received no later than December 23, 2009.

We will receive more applications than we have space for in the program. We believe that a smaller, more intimate program has proven to be most beneficial for the participants. By accepting a larger number of CITs, we feel that we would be compromising the integrity of the program. It is important to us that all applicants and parents understand how difficult it is for us to make these decisions. We try to accept candidates who we feel will benefit most from the program and will contribute most to our summer camp community. We have tremendous respect for every person who applies to this program and it is not our intention to hurt anyone's feelings. **Please understand the importance of getting your application in on time.**

Any applications received after December 23 will not be considered if the program is already full.





CIT Summer Camp Program Overview

Purpose of the program

Our focus for the CIT program is on developing leadership skills that you can use throughout your life to help yourself and others to identify and achieve goals. You will also learn how to effectively lead children, both at camp and in many other settings. Our focus is also to incorporate the YMCA Four Core Values of Caring, Honesty, Respect, and Responsibility in everything that we do.

Skills you will learn

The leadership skills include communication; teamwork; setting goals and making plans to achieve them; making decisions; developing strong relationships with others; developing increased confidence; organization; creativity; handling conflicts and solving problems.

The skills for leading children include communicating with children, with a special emphasis on listening and teaching positive behavior and values; handling undesired behavior and conflicts in positive ways; leading games and activities; teaching skills in program areas; presenting in front of small and large groups; and earning respect from others. You will also learn about how camp operates, the roles and duties of camp administrators and staff, and how camps serve the community.

How and where you can use these skills

The leadership skills that will be learned can be used in all parts of life, including home, school, sports, youth groups, work, and in the community.

The skills for leading children can be used in any work that you ever do with children, in any part-time, full-time or volunteer work throughout your life, including: camps, education, mentoring, recreation, psychology, social work, child care, and youth groups.

How these skills will be taught

Camp is about learning by doing, so you will learn these skills in a safe environment through a variety of fun and challenging activities, workshops, and discussions. You will have opportunities to work directly with campers under the mentorship of knowledgeable camp staff. You will get practice in leading groups and teaching games and skills. You will also get to create, plan and present your own special events and programs for other campers and staff. You will receive frequent feedback and evaluations, do self-evaluations and keep a 'Leadership Log' (journal) to help you get the most from your experiences.

This program is not for everyone

This program is for young people who are highly motivated, ready to work and play hard, and who demonstrate additional responsibility in accepting the challenges of leadership. It would not be productive to include young people who will disrupt the program and make it very difficult for others to enjoy and learn from the experience. Not all programs fit everyone all of the time. Unfortunately, we have a limited number of spaces in our program, and not all who apply are accepted.
